Information Sheet : International Shipment of VOLVO (V-EMB) Wooden Packaging

Considerable damage and loss to native tress populations has been caused by uncontrolled pests and organisms spreading from country to country. Non treated Wooden packaging material is believed to have played a part in this, as a consequence;

The International Standard for Phytosanitary Measures No. 15 (ISPM 15) was created and adopted in March 2002 by the IPPC, (International Plant Protection Convention), and is now under implementation globally.

These regulations set a common standard for Wooden material used in International trade.

The ISPM 15 Rules dictate that All Non manufactured Wood should be De-barked and Heat-treated and marked preferably on at least two opposite sides. (fig 1) to an agreed standard. The markings should contain:

- The IPPC Symbol,
- (XX) ISO 2 Letter country code
- (0000) Unique Producer / Treatment provider registration number
- Internationally agreed abbreviation Treatment code. (YY)

Most Volvo packaging has for many years, (prior to these standards) been debarked and heat treated, however in order to comply – Packaging MUST now have the new approved markings. (fig 1) Failure to comply with these regulations may cause shipments to be denied entry to a country, resulting in costly delays and potential disturbances to Production.

When you order packaging from Volvo, our aim is to provide you with 100% compliant material. However there is a risk you may receive some that is not . It is your responsibility to check each piece prior to use. Non compliant packaging can be used inside the EU or the country you are in, but should not be used for international flows. we would therefore advise that export packaging (where possible) has Two clear, legible markings in visible locations per packaging piece (when in use).

It is also Vital, to ensure that No ISPM markings are later covered, wholly or partially by the addition of labels, Stickers or document holders etc. Custom officials may not remove or check under labels and may deem packaging without visible markings as non-conforming.

Packaging that is constructed of 100% manufactured wood (such as Ply-wood or fibre board) does not fall under these regulations and therefore does not need to have any ISPM stamps to conform^{*}. * Some V-EMB Packaging constructed from manufactured wood is stamped with ISPM markings.







ISPM markings must be fully visible on Export packaging





No ISPM markings should be covered- wholly or partially by labels, stickers or document holders. Custom officials may not remove or check under labels and may deem packaging without 2 visible markings per piece as non-conforming !

Never attach labels to Plastic boxes with staples ! Staples should only be used on wood.

Latest Version (2012 +) of ISPM 15 stamp Still has IPPC logo, country code and unique registration number - but DB, KD and MB have been removed (see above) This marking is compliant for international shipments –

Clarity of Markings

Whilst the regulations say that at least one Stamp must be legible – To avoid possible rejection from Customs (in particular airfreight) -try to ensure that Pallets and frames have two clear visible stamps -on each piece.





Try to avoid Markings that have unclear letters or numbers The IPPC 'Wheat ' Logo should also be clear and visible.

•Where to look for Markings (Frames)



Frames are manufactured using Solid wood and therefore need to be marked to comply .

Re- Heat treated & Hot branded ISPM mark – on both Short sides (right hand side) may also have white circle paint mark . The additional paint mark is an aid to identification and

The additional paint mark is an aid to identification and **can not** be used as proof of ISPM 15 compliancy

DUE TO THE SMALL ISPM MARK IT IS RECOMENDED THAT THE 'VOLVO' BRANDED FRAMES ARE NOT USED – (Especially for Airfreight)

'V- EMB' logo Frames made post 2004-2006 INK Stamped mark on both Short sides (Right hand side) All V-EMB branded Frames have been treated to the new ISPM 15 standards –



'V- EMB' logo Frames made post 2006 White screen print mark on both Short sides (Right hand side) All V-EMB branded Frames have been treated to the new ISPM 15 standards.

'V- EMB' logo Frames made post 2017 White screen print mark on both Short and long sides .

Some now have an additional stamp far right all sides

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•Where to look for Markings (Lids)

The production process for Manufactured wood board – such as Ply and hardboard makes the need for additional heat treatment unnecessary and therefore no need for ISPM 15 stamps . **Spacers made 100% from ply-wood do not need to be marked**

Some of our older lids were manufactured with Solid plain -wood guiding bars. If used, these need to have a ISPM logo



Spacers made from solid wood such as EMB 752 should have a stamp to be compliant.
